Summoning of Parliament

WHEREAS it is provided by Article 88 (1) of the Constitution that each session of Parliament shall be held at such place within Zambia, and shall commence at such time as the President may appoint:

AND WHEREAS it is expedient that Parliament should be summoned:

NOW THEREFORE, under and by virtue of the powers in me vested, I, FREDERICK JACOB TRUS CHILUBA, President of the Republic of Zambia, do hereby proclaim and make known that the Third Session of the Seventh Parliament shall resume in Lusaka at 1000 hours on the 21st day of January, 1994.
